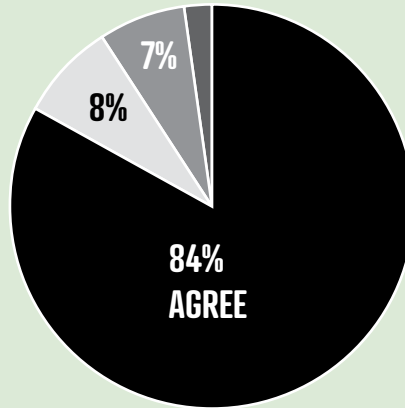


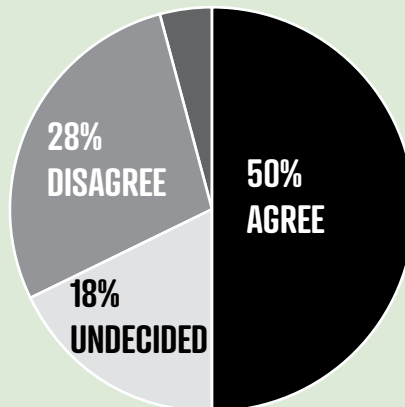
POSITIVE OPINIONS ON CANNABIS USE FOR MEDICINAL REASONS BUT DIVIDED OPINIONS ABOUT PERSONAL USE

A majority (84%) agreed that cannabis products should be legally available for people with a terminal illness. Seven percent disagreed, while eight percent were undecided.

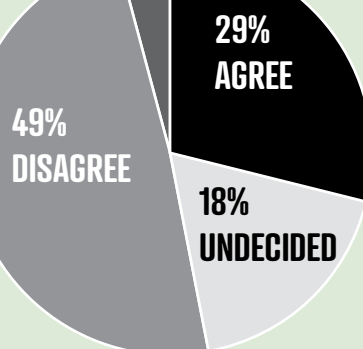


MEDICINAL USE FOR TERMINAL ILLNESS

Half (50%) agreed that cannabis products should be legally available for non-terminal medical conditions, such as back pain. Twenty eight percent disagreed, while eighteen percent were undecided.



MEDICINAL USE FOR NON-TERMINAL ILLNESS



While 29% agreed, almost half (49%) disagreed that the use of cannabis for personal reasons should be legalised in New Zealand. Eighteen percent were undecided.
