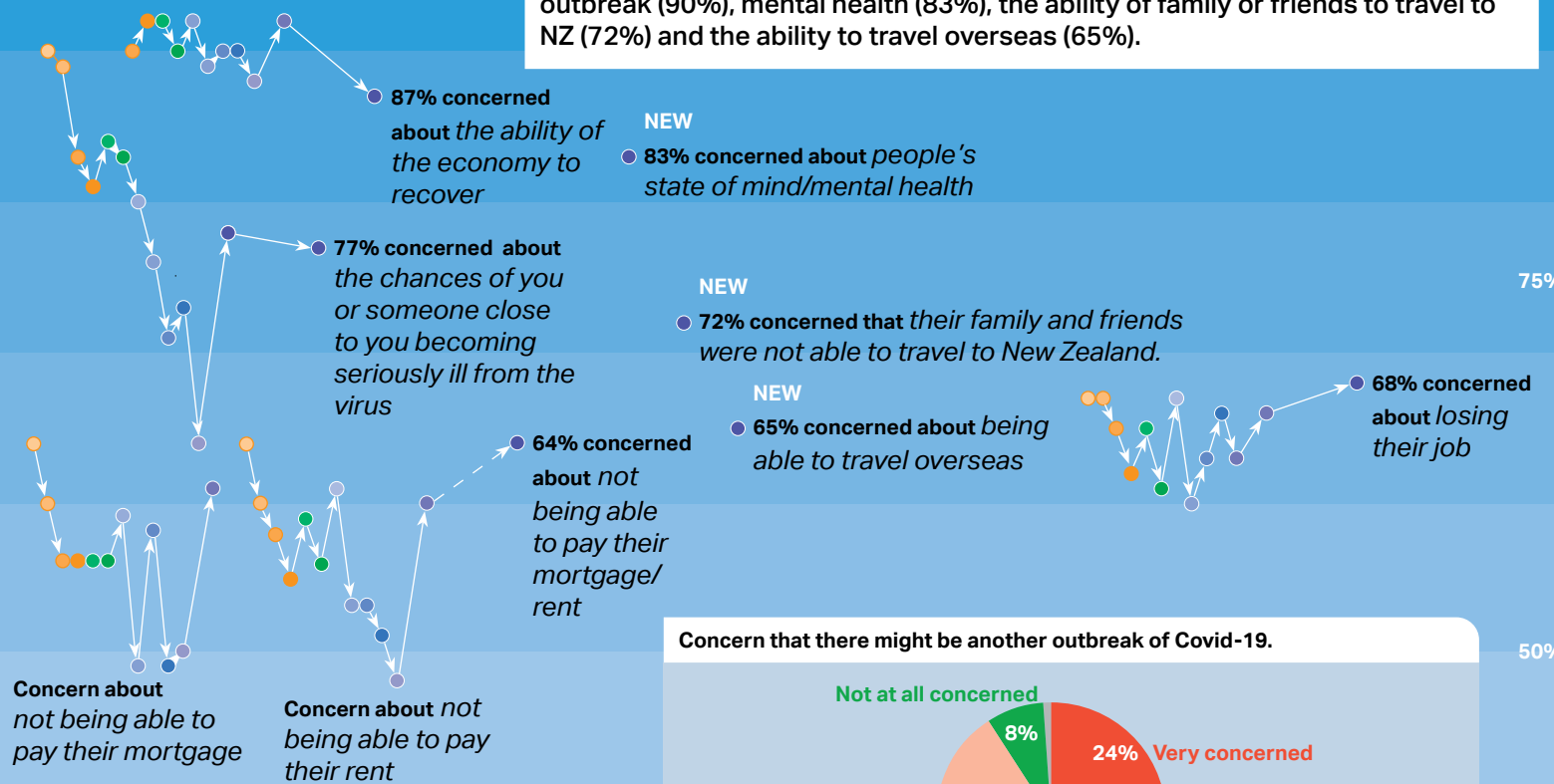
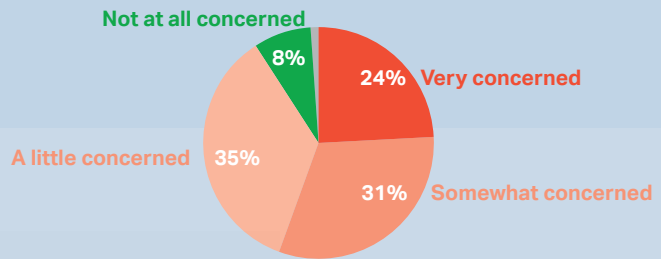


Covid-19 New Zealand Report 15: No New worries and concerns about another Covid-19 outbreak, travel and mental health

Concerns remain high for many issues for respondents. Additionally there were new measures of concern about the chances of another Covid-19 outbreak (90%), mental health (83%), the ability of family or friends to travel to NZ (72%) and the ability to travel overseas (65%).



Concern that there might be another outbreak of Covid-19.

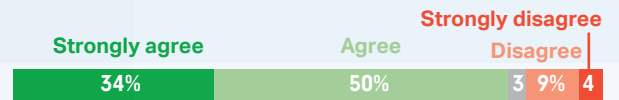


A majority (90%) of respondents were concerned that there might be another Covid-19 outbreak.

The "Team of 5 Million"

Twice the percentage of respondents were in strong agreement that the NZ Government/officials (34%), and the Team of 5 Million (16%), are doing enough to prevent another Covid-19 outbreak.

These results are based on our recent surveys of 1,000 respondents 18 years and over, each sourced from Dynata, and conducted online during these dates.

The maximum margin of error is +/- 3.1 percent (at the 95 percent confidence level). The samples have been weighted by gender and age to ensure the results are representative of the population 18 years and over. The surveys were not undertaken on behalf of any organisation, but as part of Research New Zealand's social polling of New Zealanders' opinions about current issues.
