

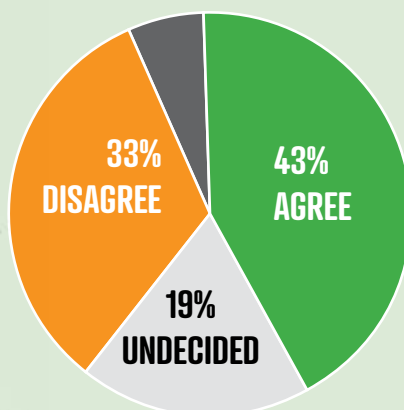
CHANGING OPINIONS ON

LEGALISING CANNABIS FOR PERSONAL USE

Although a direct comparison cannot be made between these two polls, the significantly greater percentage of respondents giving a positive answer in 2020 may represent a change in opinion.

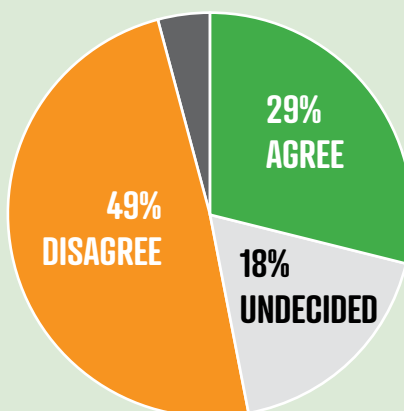
GOVERNMENT CONTROLLING, BY LAW, HOW CANNABIS IS GROWN, MANUFACTURED AND SOLD IN NZ FOR RECREATIONAL USE



Forty-three percent (43%) of respondents stated they were in favour of the government controlling, by law, how cannabis is grown, manufactured and sold in New Zealand for recreational use. Thirty-three percent (33%) disagreed, while nineteen percent were undecided.

PERSONAL USE

Twenty-nine percent (29%) of respondents agreed, and almost half (49%) disagreed that the use of cannabis for personal reasons should be legalised in New Zealand (eighteen percent were undecided).



On two occasions we polled a nationally representative sample of New Zealanders aged 18 years and over; 1000 respondents between 6 and 9 March 2020, and 1,220 respondents between 3 and 17 March 2019. The maximum margin of error is for the 2020 poll is +/- 3.1% and +/- 3.8 % for the 2019 poll (at the 95 percent confidence level). The results have been weighted.
